blues: a type of slow, sad jazz music first sung by African-Americans

culture: an appreciation for the arts, such as music, literature, and painting; ideas, customs, traditions, and way of life of a group of people

Harlem: a neighborhood in New York City, on the northern half of Manhattan Island

Harlem Renaissance: a cultural movement that took place in New York City in the 1920s and 1930s in which African-Americans created an important body of art, music, science, literature, and humanities.

jazz: a lively, rhythmic type of music, first developed by African-Americans, in which players often improvise, or make up their own tunes, and add new notes in unexpected places.
