



**cello:** an instrument of the violin family, between the viola and the double bass in size and pitch; (the instrument's full name is violoncello)

**debut:** a first appearance before the public (i.e., an actor's first live play, a musician's first live concert, etc.)

**liberal arts:** the subjects of an academic college course, including literature, philosophy, languages, history, and usually, survey courses of the sciences, as distinguished from professional or technical subjects; sometimes referred to as the arts, as in Bachelor of Arts

**musicologist:** a person who systematically studies the science, history, forms, and methods of music

**repertoire:** the stock of plays, operas, roles, or songs that an actor, singer, etc., is familiar with and ready to perform
